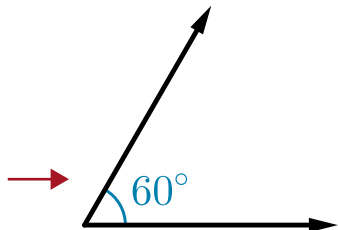
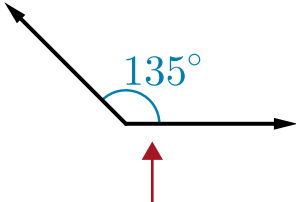
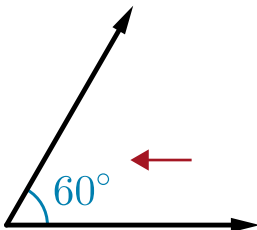


Exterior of an Angle

Definition

The **exterior of an angle** is the **space outside the angle**, not between its two sides.

In simpler terms, it's **any area that is not inside the angle**.
